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A HABIT OR A HOBBY?

I had the privilege of growing up in a church similar to Meadowlands. My parents were fairly new converts. Our church was our life, and that had a great impact on our family. One of the memories I had of church was the tradition of gathering around the auditorium after each of our communion services, linking hands, and singing the hymn, "Blest Be the Tie That Binds." At the time, I didn't really care about that tradition as I was of the age where holding hands wasn't my cup of tea! But that 'fellowship of kindred minds' was part of the blessing of being together as a church family, and gave a sense of what believers would enjoy for all eternity in heaven before the throne of God.



After September 11, 2001, church attendance grew as people considered their own spiritual condition in light of the events of that day and the days following it. Unfortunately, it didn't take long before many of those folks returned to life as it had been.

During this current crisis, for all of us at Meadowlands, it's been a wonderful blessing to sense a renewed desire to be together, a hope that our time apart will be short, and a realization that God's intent for our church is not to meet remotely. **But how do we keep thinking church gatherings are important even when all of this is over?** What can we do so that our meetings together don't lose their urgency in our minds? We must determine now to make our gatherings a habit, as the Bible instructs us in Hebrews 10:25. And we commit anew to make the meetings of the body of Christ a priority for our families over almost anything that would intrude on those times.

It was years before I realized the hymn "Blest Be the Tie That Binds" had more than one verse.

The last verse puts into perspective what we face now as a church family.

"When we asunder part It gives us inward pain; But we shall still be joined in heart, And hope to meet again."

We pray that will be soon!


