

RESPONDING TO THE GLORY OF GOD





"...children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights..." Phil. 2:15

Over the last several weeks we've been able to observe a variety of responses to this current situation—from panic to indifference, and everything in between. Here are four instructions that will help you to respond in a way that glorifies God.

1. CARE

We should care about the suffering and death of fellow human beings. Since mankind is made in God's image (Gen 1:27), every human life is precious from the moment of conception to the final breath in death. Christ commands, "love your neighbour as yourself" (Matt 22:39). Philippians 2:3 even urges us to treat other as better than ourselves. Coronavirus gives us opportunities to respond with care.

2. SHARE

Although we are trying not to share germs, times of crisis give God's people opportunities to share the truth. We may not understand this virus and what actions should be taken, but we do know the truth of God's Word. God says that all have sinned (Rom 3:23), and we will all eventually die (Rom 6:23). Although we pray for a cure or vaccine for this virus, the greater need is salvation from sin and hell. All human crises are opportunities to share the truth of the Gospel (Luke 13:1-5).

3. BEWARE

In our current situation, we need to beware of ungodly attitudes. It is natural to react in fear, anger, or despair. We must not forget that God is still in control. We can trust our heavenly Father instead of worry (Matt 6:25-34). By relying on the Lord and His promises, we can maintain joy (Phil 4:4) and peace (Phil 4:6-7). And we can even demonstrate gracious spirit toward others (Phil 4:5).

4. PREPARE

A month ago, many folks were preparing for a toilet paper shortage! We, however, need to prepare ourselves for suffering. We don't really know the lasting effects of this virus and the resulting lock-down. There could be lasting pain. But we can prepare our hearts for this by remembering that nothing can separate us from Christ and His eternal blessings (Rom 8:31-39). Loss in this life should cause us to prepare for the life to come. Remember: this world is not our home! We are living in a unique opportunity to glorify God by how we respond. I pray that the responses of God's people will shine brightly in this dark world and glorify our Heavenly Father (Matt 5:16).



- 3. In what ways did Jesus display this quality to others?
- 4. When is obedience to this command most difficult for you?
- 5. When should we be uncompromising and when should we be accommodating?
- 6. What biblical realities accompany the Lord's coming?
- 7. How does the Lord's coming motivate us to react in a spirit of gentleness?

This year began with many regular activies. Seminary classes began with 25 sutdents in January. Children's classes at Emanuel and Grace Baptist Church continued as normal. A work project on the camp property was begun in March, but everything came to a halt on March 18.

Due to the coronavirus pandemic, all normal activities have been suspended, from seminary classes, church services and construction at camp. We are able to leave our home only on days that coincide with the last number of our Bolivian identity card for just a few hours. Getting groceries has been a little like a scavenger hunt. We are helping those that the Lord brings into our path. Our neighbours with need or young pastors that because there are no services, have no salaries. We contnue to monitor news, shelter in place and pray for this crisis to pass.
