WHY WE GATHER


The last several weeks have been a hardship for believers around the world, as God intends His people to regularly gather. Although online services have facilitated a way for us to worship while apart, it is a poor substitute for gathering together in person.

Most Christians are familiar with the words of Hebrews 10:25 —"Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together." Although assembling together is important, that is not the main point of the passage. This command to assemble comes immediately after the command in Hebrews 10:24—"And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works." You see, warming a seat in a church building is not what we are called to. **The reason God's people gather is to "stir up love and good works" in each other.** In addition, Hebrews 10:25 goes on to urge us to "encourage one another."

I am very excited to return to our Sunday morning gatherings, beginning June 21. This week Premier Kenney announced the guidelines and restrictions for phase 2 of reopening. There is no limit to the number of people allowed for a worship service, as long as physical distancing requirements are met. These new guidelines allow us to resume our responsibility to "stir up love and good works" and "encourage one another."

Due to the size of our auditorium and the physical distancing of two metres between households, our seating capacity will be limited to approximately 100 people. Therefore, the overflow will need to go the gym to watch the service on a screen. We will sing with moderation in the auditorium, but we will refrain from singing (humming allowed) in the gym, as some members of our church family need to be more cautious.

Our government leaders have encouraged greater caution for those who are older or have health problems. We want to protect anyone who may be vulnerable. We will live-stream the Sunday worship service and post the recording online afterwards. We will also continue to offer the prayer and Bible study group on Wednesdays at 7 pm in-person in the auditorium or via Zoom throughout the summer. Part of loving and encouraging each other is serving and deferring to the needs and preferences of others. These unique times give us many opportunities to "look out for the interests of others" and "esteem others as better than yourself" (Phil 2:3-4).

- Sunday, June 28: 6 PM in auditorium (Last class for the summer)

RE-OPENING UPDATE

We desire unity for our church as we move forward with plans to re-gather. We realize there is a range of differing opinions in our congregation on what this looks like; therefore, we want to continue to minister to everyone in a way that matches each one's comfort level. We ask for patience and grace as we make adjustments throughout the summer. With prayerful consideration, the church leadership presents the following for re-opening:

General Guidelines:

- There is no limit to the number of people allowed for a worship service.
- Physical distancing of 2 metres should be maintained between congregants unless members of the same household.
- Congregants must not attend if experiencing COVID-19 symptoms (cough, fever, runny nose, sore throat, short of breath).
- Refrain from shaking hands, hugging, touching, passing items between people, using hymnbooks, passing offering plates, etc.
- Nursery is not permitted. Young children should remain with parents.

Our Plan:

- Begin on Father's Day, Sunday, June 21 with only one service: 10:30 am.
- The main service will take place in the auditorium, and overflow will be in the gym.
- The service in the auditorium will be video live streamed for folks at home and in the gym.
- The auditorium and gym chairs will be arranged with rows two metres apart.
- The service in the auditorium will include congregational singing.
- The service in the gym will NOT include congregational singing (humming allowed). Those not wanting to sing or be around singing should go to the gym.
- Children are welcome, but there will be no nursery or children's classes. A children's story will be included as part of the Sunday morning worship service.
- Main doors, school doors, and gym doors will be available for entry and exit.
- Hand sanitation stations will be placed at all entry/exit points.
- Face masks may be worn but will not be required.
- Only the main floor will be accessible; second and third floors will be closed.
- All main floor washrooms will be available.
- A receptacle for giving will be available outside the church office. Giving online will continue to be available.
- We will discontinue the prerecorded service since the Sunday service will be livestreamed. Those who stay home can watch the entire service live or anytime afterwards.
- There will no longer be a need to register ahead of time for services and Bible studies.
