

Dear Church Family,

You have probably heard by now that the Edmonton city council passed a bylaw requiring face coverings in all indoor public spaces. This mandate goes into effect tomorrow and includes all indoor church gatherings.

I talked to a representative from the city's bylaw department to get some clarification of how this will impact the fellowship and worship in our church facility on Sundays. I was told that anyone teaching, speaking from the pulpit, or performing music qualifies under the exception of "engaging in services that require the temporary removal of a face covering." The bylaw also makes an exception for "persons unable to wear a face covering due to mental or physical concern or limitation." There may be several people in our congregation who do not wear a mask on Sunday or remove their mask during the service for one of these reasons.

This bylaw will not be enforced by our church, and we should all assume that anyone not wearing a face covering has a good reason. We should not be judgmental of anyone's motive. I am planning to wear a mask indoors except when I am speaking from the pulpit. I will attempt to sing with a mask on, but I'm not looking forward to it! If the weather allows, I will enjoy conversation outside without a face covering. A limited number of masks will be available; however, we encourage you to bring your own.

Around the year AD 57, there was a Christian living under the tyrannical rule of Emperor Nero. This follower of Christ was eventually beheaded under this cruel regime that persecuted Christians. Before his martyrdom, he wrote a letter to believers living in the capital city—the home of Nero. In his letter to them he wrote, "Let every soul be subject to the governing authorities." He commanded them to obey Nero and the other pagan Roman authorities. He also wrote that "the authorities that exist are appointed by God;" therefore, "whoever resists the authority resists the ordinance of God." Three times he refers to government officials as "God's ministers."

You can see why the Christians in Rome needed instruction about this. Should they submit to such a wicked government? Should they rebel in response to excessive overreach? Should they pay taxes to an emperor who was murdering their brothers and sisters? The letter answers these questions by saying, "Render therefore to all their due: taxes to whom taxes are due, customs to whom customs, fear to whom fear, honor to whom honor." Not only should Christians obey and pay taxes to a corrupt government, but they should do so with respect.

If an authority ever commands you to do something that God forbids or forbids you to do something that God commands, then you must "obey God rather than men" (Acts 5:29). He is the higher authority. Yet even civil disobedience must be respectful. But if governing authorities are not commanding us to commit sin, we are obligated to obey them as God's ministers, even if they are ungodly and irresponsible, and their mandates seem unreasonable.

That ancient letter written to citizens under Nero was authored by the apostle Paul under divine inspiration (Romans 13:1-7). These instructions about our responsibility toward government leaders are just as relevant and authoritative today as they were nearly 2,000 years ago. Praise God that we can rest in His sovereign control over the leaders He has appointed! I pray that God would help us to be wise and respectful when submission to government is especially difficult.

MISSIONARY UPDATE

I was recently reminded of James 4:13-15 by a pastor friend. Although I don't have any plans to "buy, sell and get gain" we have had to change many plans due to Coronavirus. James teaches us to hold to our plans loosely, since God's purposes may differ from our plans! So much of what we planned has had to be postponed or canceled. God has his own timetable.

For instance, we planned to leave South Africa in the middle of June, travel across Canada and the USA for about 6 months visiting supporting churches, sharing what God has been doing through us in South Africa and getting our visas renewed.
