



HOPE THAT DOES NOT DISAPPOINT

Dealing with disappointment is a fact of life. We are confronted with these things every day, if not multiple times in a day. We expect one thing and something else happens instead. Often, these things are minor, and we've learned to deal with them as they come. But when we desire something to turn out a certain way so badly and it doesn't, our experience is that which is described in Proverbs 13:12, "Hope deferred makes the heart sick!" Most people can relate: a desired career advancement falls through, plans for a special vacation have to be put on hold, or someone other than your desired candidate wins an election. The list of examples could continue to include things we've experienced during the last five months of this pandemic. But there is one hope that will not result in disappointment. It can't. We have God's infallible Word to back that up. Paul writes in Romans 5:5, "Now hope does not disappoint..." What is the hope to which he refers? Is it a financial hope? No. Is it a hope that I get the job I've always wanted? No. The hope Paul refers to is the hope of the gospel that gives us peace with God through Jesus Christ.





This hope is a guaranteed hope because we have been given the Holy Spirit when we repented of our sins and placed our faith in Christ. It is a living hope, according to 1 Peter 1:3-5, made possible by Christ's resurrection from the dead. John writes in his first epistle that it is a purifying hope that gives each believer the motivation to be different from the world. And ultimately, it is an eternal hope that because Christ lives, we will live also. It's when we focus on this "blessed hope" (Titus 2:13), that we are able to put earthly disappointments in perspective. We are often tempted to despair because of a desire that goes unmet. We may think, "I even prayed about it and had peace this was God's will for me," and that seems to add to the disappointment. During these inevitable times, may God help us realize His goodness in saving us and reconciling us to Himself through the sacrifice of His Son on our behalf. May He shine the light of His Word in our hearts and provide the soothing comfort from His Holy Spirit to help us realize that the greatest hope we can have will surely come to pass.
