Over the last few months we have become familiar with words and phrases that we probably had not heard much before. Social distancing, flatten the curve, coronavirus, PPE, asymptomatic, and contact tracing are now regular vocabulary used in news reports and even every day conversation. This highlights the fact that our daily lives have changed in many ways.

Change is often unsettling, and we are observing a variety of reactions in our society to this fast-paced change: anxiety, fear, frustration, anger, and despair. But God's children are different. We respond differently because we have a personal relationship with our unchanging Heavenly Father.

Moses understood turbulence as he led the people of Israel for forty years in the desert. To the Lord he said, "Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever You had formed the earth and the world, even from everlasting to everlasting, You are God" (Ps 90:2). When our circumstances are tumultuous we can cling to our unchanging God. The Lord Himself declared, "I am Yahweh; I do not change" (Mal 3:6). Aren't you thankful for that? Our hope is not in returning to normal or adjusting to the new normal; our hope is in God.

The Psalmist reminds us that the foundation of the earth and the heavens will perish. They will grow old like a garment and change (Ps 102:25-26). But he proclaims to the Lord, "You are the same, and Your years will have no end" (Ps 102:27). Hymn writer Walter Smith put it this way: "To all, life Thou givest, to both great and small. In all life Thou livest, the true life of all. We blossom and flourish as leaves on the tree, and whither and perish, but naught changeth Thee." Your health may change. Your economic status may change. Your career may change. Your relationships may change. But because of God's unchanging promises, your eternal standing as God's child will never change!

Let me encourage you to look at your changing circumstances through the lens of your unchanging God. When you communicate with believers this week, point your brothers and sisters to our Heavenly Father and His steadfast promises. And when you have opportunities to talk with those who are fearful or angry, share the hope that can only come from a relationship with our faithful God.


