# WALKING BY FAITH

There probably is no one reading this short article who hasn't at one time or another noticed that people who have no desire for God often seem to experience the good blessings of life that at times seem so elusive for the believer. The temptation is strong for us to notice that the grass often seems a little greener on the other side of the fence. We may even have moments when we think, "If following God is supposed to be the path of blessedness, why does that blessedness seem to regularly pass me by?" There are several possible answers we could give from God's Word. Perhaps God is trying to show us how much our flesh truly is desiring the things of the world rather than the things that are of God. Perhaps we're not delighting ourselves in the Lord so that He can change our desires to be more in line with His good will for us. But I think that we often take our eyes off of how God defines one who is truly blessed compared to the wicked man as defined in the first Psalm:

"Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor stands in the path of sinners, nor sits in the seat of the scornful. But his delight is in the law of the Lord and in His law he meditates day and night."

The blessed man is then described as a tree that is planted by the rivers of water, that brings forth fruit in its season, whose leaf does not wither, and whatever he does prospers. The Scripture writer mentions nothing about the stormy winds or times of drought which had come upon that tree to strengthen it into what it was to become. "We must not always estimate the fulfilment of a promise by our own eye-sight," writes Spurgeon. Why? Because our sight often sees the very opposite of what God promises. And that's why we must walk by faith, and not by sight (2 Cor. 5:7). The Apostle Paul tells us that the things we see are temporary; the things we don't see, that are to be seen through the eyes of faith, those are the things that are eternal (2 Cor. 4:17-18). May God help you and me to see, again in the words of Spurgeon, that "there is a blessing concealed in the righteous man's crosses, losses, and sorrows. The trials of the saint are a divine husbandry, by which he grows and brings forth abundant fruit." (from *Treasury of David*)
