Each day we are confronted with competing truth claims. The media is continually telling us what to believe and what not to believe. In addition to the media, we regularly listening to declarations of truth in conversations with neighbors, coworkers, friends, and family. Much of what we hear is contradictory. So how do we discern that is true? What about important issues like morality, relationships, personal identity, and God? Fortunately, we are not left to ourselves to figure out what is true. God has given us a standard to measure everything we hear. That divine standard is God's Word.

On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther made a list of 95 reasons why the church's practice of selling indulgences (money exchanged for God's forgiveness) was wrong. He appealed to Scripture as a higher authority than religious tradition and the pope. He posted that list on the front door of the main church in town lighting a fuse that exploded all over Europe. The battle cry of the Reformation was the Latin phrase *Sola Scriptura*—Scripture alone is our infallible authority.

Luther's bold preaching and writing eventually landed him in front of an imperial council accusing him of heresy. As he stood before the court, they demanded that he recant his writings. Luther famously responded with these words:



We need the same conviction about the Bible held by Martin Luther. The Word of God is our ultimate authority. And we may even have to pay a price for taking a stand with Scripture when it is not popular in our society. We can be confident, though, that God will help us as we rely on Him.

On Sunday morning we will commemorate the Reformation by remembering some believers of the past who stood for the truth of Scripture in spite of persecution and martyrdom. This "great cloud of witnesses" inspires us to look to Jesus and run the race with endurance (Heb 12:1).



Unless I am convinced by the testimony of the Scriptures or by clear reason (for I do not trust either in the pope or in councils alone, since it is well known that they have often erred and contradicted themselves), I am bound by the Scriptures I have quoted and my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and will not recant anything, since it is neither safe nor right to go against conscience. Here I stand. I can do no other. God help me!

SUNDAY MORNING WORSHIP 9:30 OR 11 AM


Due to restrictions, nurseries are unavailable at this time, but classes are available for ages 2-3 for each service.


WEDNESDAY PRAYER & BIBLE STUDY/KIDS 4 TRUTH 7 PM
