A CHRISTIAN'S CONFIDENCE

For a while now, we have been inundated with news from the States concerning the upcoming election. It remains to be seen if it will be known, by this time next week, which of the candidates will be president for the next four years.

Politicians and pundits from both sides of the ideological aisle have dubbed this election the most important one in the history of America. People are quick to put their hopes in a preferred outcome of an election or in a certain candidate, whoever that may be. As believers, we often forget that our hope is in a God Who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think because of Who He is, not based on the circumstances of life which come upon us. And this is the point that Habakkuk makes at the end of his prophecy. In chapter three, Habakkuk recounts God's blessing to the nation of Israel, especially in the time directly after their bondage in Egypt. Can you imagine the relief the people experienced after being under the oppression of Pharaoh? They not only had been delivered, but then they witnessed the destruction of that wicked ruler and his entire army at the Red Sea. Sadly, Habakkuk foresaw the heartache God's people were going to endure facing yet another captivity, this time in Babylon, and his heart ached for them. But he concludes his prophecy putting all of that into perspective: "Though the fig tree may not blossom, nor fruit be on the vines; though the labor of the olive may fail, and the fields yield no food; though the flock may be cut off from the fold, and there be no herd in the stalls- yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will joy in the God of my salvation."

In his commentary, pastor and author F.B. Meyer said this about Habakkuk, "If all God's gifts failed, he would still possess the Giver. He could still triumph in God. Indeed, the divine Savior and Friend is often more apparent when the fields and the farmsteads are bare." How true! We all face times when what we had hoped would occur doesn't, when what we have set our hearts on fails to come to pass, when we lose out on something we feel is of utmost importance. But when we realize that our hope and security are found in a good and faithful God, we can have confidence that He is going to work it all out for our good and His glory.

Watts sought, in the original nine stanzas of this hymn, to calm the fears of his countrymen by pointing out to them, in verse, that the same God who had been their help in the past was their hope for the future.


