Last month a couple of my children distributed fliers around our neighbourhood advertising snow removal. They were eager for the first snowfall so they could make some money. You may not get as excited about snow as my children, but we can all appreciate the beauty of snow. All the brown grass is now covered in white—and probably will be for another five months! The Bible gives us an image that is even more beautiful. Through the prophet Isaiah, God tells His rebellious people to repent, and He promises them: "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be white as snow" (Isa 1:18).

Think of a red Kool-Aid spill on white carpet—the stain is hard to get out. And the stain of our sin is much worse. The Lord calls the people of Judah "a sinful nation laden with

iniquity" (Isa 1:4). They were "a brood of evil doers" who had "provoked to anger the Holy One" (Isa 1:4). God does not excuse sin, but He will forgive those who turn back to Him (Isa 1:16-17). He will wash out the scarlet stain making it white as snow

King David experienced the blessing of God's forgiveness. He had sinned and tried to hide his guilt. It had plagued him for months. But David finally repented and was restored to fellowship with God. He prayed, "Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow" (Ps 51:7). So as we see the beautiful snow all around—and shovel it off our driveways—let's remember the beauty of God's complete forgiveness.

Lord Jesus, I long to be perfectly whole, I want Thee forever to live in my soul; Break down every idol, cast out every foe; Now wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.


