#### **TRUSTING A POWERFUL GOD**

"This is my Father's world, O let me ne'er forget that though the wrong seems oft so strong, God is the Ruler yet." And how thankful we are that God is in control even when everything seems to point in a different direction. It certainly seemed to be pointing in a different direction in the book of Esther. The details of this true story are beyond anything most of us have endured. The Jews were in grave danger. The king had decreed they were to be put to death. It seemed that nothing was going to keep this from happening. But the night before Queen Esther was going to plead for her people before King Xerxes, the king was unable to sleep. Whether he thought they would help him get to sleep or whether there was some more official reason, the king called for the official government records to be brought and read.

The book that was chosen, it seems at random, was from five years before, and it contained the account of the queen's uncle, Mordecai, unveiling a plot to assassinate the king. "What honor or dignity has been bestowed on Mordecai for this?" the king asked. His attendants answered, "Nothing has been done for him." These events were the beginning of the end for Haman, the mastermind behind the plot to kill the Jews. God was gracious to spare His people, an event that is still celebrated in Israel at the festival of Purim or Feast of Lots. This example is one of many in Scripture which reminds us that our confidence is in a God Who gives "grace to help in time of need" (Hebrews 4:16). We are thankful when God allows times of ease into our lives. But it is the same good God that brings the times of need, as well. We know that the same God Who brought insomnia upon a powerful king and caused a servant to pick the exact book in which Mordecai's actions were recorded, is the same God Who watches over us. He is the Ruler, and we can trust Him. "Therefore, we do not lose heart..." (2 Cor. 4:16).

First, we would like to speak of God's faithfulness to us and to the Ellman family. As I told you in our last letter, the Ellman's lost their 10-year-old son in a motor vehicle accident. We held his funeral on Nov.23. Herb brought a brief sermon from Hebrews 12:1-2 on how it is better to run a short race well than run a long race poorly. The gospel was clearly presented and we continue to interact with people who were part of that service. Pray for fruit that would result from the ministry of the Word at the funeral. Pray that God would continue to flood their lives with his grace and comfort.

Praise the Lord for his faithfulness in preserving us through our COVID-19 infection. We are grateful.

We passed out a set of "founding documents" that we wrote up for our church, but then COVID came and we haven't been able to discuss/vote on officially forming our church. However, we continue to see new faces at our gatherings.

Many of you know about Brandon, who is almost like an adopted son to us. We have certainly seen fruit in his life. Brandon is responsible for most of the boys who attend our boy's Bible study! He has a passion for telling others about Christ. Pray for him. He faces an uncertain future...maybe God would burden his heart for Bible training after high school?!

I have also mentioned Luciano several times. He told me he understands he's a sinner, and he knows what Christ has done for him, but he's scared of what a life of following Christ would mean. Please pray that Luciano would see that what he gains will far outweigh what he might lose, and turn to Christ!

Our van continues to work, although I am hesitant to take it too far. Between our savings and your gifts, God has provided about \$12,000.
