

REDEEMING THE TIME

It happens again this weekend - Daylight Saving Time. That's right. The word is "Saving" not "Savings," a mistake I found out I had been making all my life until I began to read the history behind why we turn our clocks ahead in the spring of every year (unless you live in Saskatchewan!). While the concept may have been discussed before, it wasn't until Englishman William Willet's 1907 brochure entitled, "The Waste of Daylight," that the debate really began. Willet died in 1915, a year before his efforts finally paid off, and the United Kingdom introduced what we know of now as "Daylight Saving Time."

The Apostle Paul discussed the reality of wasted time in his letter to the Ephesians. Most of us are very familiar with his admonition, "See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil" (Ephesians 5:15-16).

When Adam sinned, every day since has been characterized by evil. And because this is the case, Christians are exhorted to buy back as much of every day for Christ as we can. What is the currency that we use to do this? Our currency is obedience to Christ, taking up our cross daily, and following Him. This is what entails walking circumspectly. As we think about adjusting our clocks this weekend, perhaps we also need to permit the Holy Spirit to do a spiritual adjustment in order to live in a manner that exemplifies what Paul's instruction was to the believers at Ephesus two-thousand years ago. In a day when it is so easy to go with the flow, to spend our hours in things that have no Kingdom benefit, my prayer for all who make up Meadowlands Baptist Church is that we will redeem the time in order to "become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom (we) shine as lights in the world, holding fast the word of life" (Philippians 2:15-16).


This mid-week service takes place in-person in the auditorium. If you would like a Zoom link to participate, please email the church office.
