



A REMINDER DURING TIMES OF SUFFERING

It has been virtually impossible to escape the effects of COVID-19 over the last fourteen months. For most of us, the worst has not been sickness but the government restrictions. It has impacted our jobs, schools, and social interactions with friends and family. Of course, our regular church gatherings have been inconvenienced throughout this ordeal.

From a distance I have watched this virus sweep through churches of many of my friends. We have also prayed for several of our missionaries in other countries who have been significantly affected. A few of our church members have also had loved ones die from COVID-19 who lived outside of Canada.

Until three weeks ago, our church family seemed immune to the threat of this illness. That has certainly changed. A couple dozen have become sick, and several have had to be hospitalized. Because the virus can spread before symptoms emerge, we have unknowingly infected each other at some of our gatherings. I, most likely, caught the virus at church, and I possibly spread it to others.

As I lay in bed for over a week with pneumonia, I was reminded that God's people are not immune to suffering. We get sick like anyone else. We grieve the loss of loved ones. The gravitational pull of this fallen world affects us all.

I'm grateful for the Lord's healing! I know my church family was concerned and praying for me. I feel that my lungs have fully recovered, and I'm eager to return to pastoral ministry. I also have a heavy heart for those in our congregation who are still sick. And I grieve for those who have recently had family members die.
