



DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- 1. What is the biblical author's intention by saying that Ruth "happened to come to the part of the field belonging to Boaz"? (Ruth 2:3)
- 2. Three times in chapter 2 Ruth mentions "finding favor in one's sight" (vv. 2, 10, 13). What does she mean by "favor"?
- 3. In what ways was Boaz a channel of God's goodness to Ruth? (Ruth 2)
- 4. In what ways was Ruth a channel of God's goodness to Naomi? (Ruth 2)
- 5. Ruth is identified as "the Moabitess" by the author (Ruth 2:2, 21), and she refers to herself as a "foreigner" (Ruth 2:10). How is Boaz's kindness to a foreigner an example to us?
- 6. Is the kindness (hesed) Naomi received from the Lord or Boaz? (Ruth 2:20) What could be the point of the ambiguity?
- 7. How does Naomi's attitude change from the end of chapter 1 to the end of chapter 2? Why?
