



DIRECTING US THROUGH HIS TRUTH

We don't know much about the two men travelling on the road from Jerusalem to Emmaus in Luke 24. We do, however, know what they were discussing. Jesus had just been crucified by the Romans. As they walked, they recalled some of the mighty works they had seen Jesus perform and the powerful words they had heard Him speak. They were hoping that He was the One Who would redeem Israel. But then He had been arrested, tried, pronounced guilty by the chief priests and rulers, and sentenced to death by Pilate. But the story had taken a new twist when news began to circulate among Christ's followers that the women who had gone to the tomb that morning to anoint His body had been met by angels proclaiming that He was alive! The empty tomb had even been witnessed by two of Jesus' closest disciples. As Cleopas and his companion walked, Jesus approached them to inquire what they were talking about that made them so sad. After they had answered, Jesus said to them, "O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken" (v. 25). He went on to explain that what had happened in Jerusalem the last few days shouldn't have taken them by surprise. It had been prophesied starting with Moses and with all the Prophets. Jesus, Himself, had spoken plainly of these things. He had explained the reason He had been sent by His Father. Yet many of His followers seemed to miss the significance of His words. They did not believe. Not much has changed since then. If Jesus met you and me in our daily activities, in times of uncertainty and doubt, in our many temptations to sin, in our responses to adversity, His rebuke to us may sound similar, "O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe all I have spoken in My Word!"
