FREEDOM TO LOVE OTHERS

In Canada we sing and pray "God keep our land glorious and free." We place a high value on freedom. As Christians, we especially cherish the freedom that comes from Christ. Paul commands the church to "stand fast in the liberty by which Christ has made us free, and do not be entangled again with a yoke of bondage" (Gal 5:1). Since Christ is the fulfillment of the Old Testament ceremonial laws, God's people are no longer bound to them. I'm so glad to be free! But Paul warns, "do not use liberty as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another" (Gal 5:13). And then Paul reminds us of a law that we are bound to: "For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Gal 5:14).

Our relationship with Christ liberates us to get our eyes off of self and onto the needs of others. But that doesn't come to us naturally, which is why Paul tells the church to "walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh" (Gal 5:16). By the Holy Spirit's power, we can overcome the natural desire to please ourselves. Through the Spirit our lives will produce the fruit of "love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control." Notice that the Spirit's fruit is primarily evidenced in relationship with others. Spending time with others and serving them in love is one of our highest priorities.

We are stewards of freedom. And our Lord has called us to use our liberty for His purposes—especially to love others through His Spirit's enablement. How can you serve others this week? In what ways might the Holy Spirit influence others by the fruit He produces in you? How can you edify others this Sunday, or even at the church picnic? Let's pray that God will use us this summer to love others in response to the love Christ has shown to us.
