MBC MISSIONARY MEDICAL NEEDS

Larry & Pam Noland, Aklavik, NT

Pam was diagnosed with esophageal cancer in July while in Missouri assisting her mother, who has late stage cancer as well. Currently, Pam is in the middle of chemo and radiation treatments. After a brief rest period, she is scheduled for an extensive surgery to remove her esophagus and to re-position her stomach. A long recovery is expected. They have expenses such as insurance co-pays, deductibles, prescriptions, fuel and food expenses.

Jeremie & Amy Roy, Dominican Republic

Amy experienced some vision paralysis back in June. Testing revealed a few abnormal lesions in her brain. Though lacking some information for an official diagnosis, an MRI, blood tests and symptoms are pointing their specialist to give a diagnosis of multiple sclerosis. Currently, they are in the USA meeting with doctors to get more answers about how to deal with Amy's health. Upon returning to the DR in October, they will be moving to the capital city of Santo Domingo where Amy will have better access to her doctors and specific food supplies for her MS diet.
