

MBC MISSIONARY UPDATE FROM DARREN & ELIZABETH HAMMERMEISTER, SURREY, BC

As most are probably aware, the recent floods in British Columbia have wreaked havoc on the failing infrastructure around us. Houses, bridges, rail lines and highways have been washed away resulting in shortages in the stores and gas stations. We are thankful that neither we nor our church

We are thankful that neither we nor our church folks experienced any flood damage. However, we will all be affected by the aftermath while the province works at reconnecting our area with the remainder of the country. Since our last letter, we have been able to resume services in the community centre where we met pre-Covid. Our province has instituted a "vaccine passport" which limits access to certain public events and services, but it does not apply to worship services at this time. There are many other restrictions in place because of community centre rules, but we are grateful to be back! On December 4th Darren was able to get his "presurgery" MRI on his back. Today, he met with his surgeon and surgery will take place in 1½ -2 years (due to typical surgery wait list further exacerbated by COVID-cancelled surgeries). We have scheduled meetings this summer with all our Canadian supporting churches. However, our furlough replacements may not be able to cover for us due to border restrictions and vaccine requirements for entering Canada. In light of this, we are considering the possibility of reporting to supporting churches while ministering to the church in Surrey through Zoom or YouTube
