Last Sunday, as Pastor Mark led us in reading Philippians 2:1-11, I was convicted again by the reading of verses three and four, "Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself. Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others." It reminded me of an article* I read a number of years ago. The author's friend had announced to her father that she was expecting her fifth child. Instead of the congratulations she hoped to receive, however, she heard, "You mean, I'm going to have to ask my friend to make another rug?" For her first four children, her father's friend had handcrafted a special, one-of-a-kind rug as a baby gift for each newborn. Instead of being happy with the daughter's announcement, the father only thought of the awkwardness and potential embarrassment he might feel of asking the friend for yet another special rug. She concluded, "People are always thinking about themselves first.

Paul is certainly not prohibiting believers from having interests of their own. But for many, their self-interests seem all-consuming and blind them to what others are interested in. We can't obey the second greatest commandment of loving our neighbor as we should if we are only looking at ourselves. The author of this article gives three considerations to help us not be so self-focused. The first consideration is to train ourselves to be others focused. We understand that rejoicing with those who rejoice and weeping with those who weep (Rom. 12:15) doesn't come naturally. We often struggle showing empathy. We should fight against the natural tendency to think only how their news might affect us. Second, we need grace to put others' needs ahead of our own. God will certainly give us help to do this. Without Him, we can do nothing (Jn. 15:5). Third, we need to look to Jesus Who is our ultimate example. Jesus had the right to exalt Himself. Instead, He "made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross." As we look to our Example, Jesus, may we be motivated to be that person who considers others' interests before our own. "Others, Lord, yes others, let this my motto be; help me to live for others that I may live like Thee" (Charles D. Meigs).
